

"*National Neighborhood Watch*" has been established and Dora and all her helpers have been making and selling tamales which has been a really big success. The "Arts and Crafts and other items" fundraiser had a huge turnout, and we totally sold out of tamale plates and tamales at \$12/dozen. We want to thank all that participated in this show and hope for our next one, everyone will come back. A special thank you to Ms. Bea for donating the use of extra tables.

Also, in the making is a **POP's program (originally called MOP's)** and our dear volunteer Lori will be heading this up. POP's is our "Parents on Patrol" and they will be helping the kids in our neighborhood, also featuring educational trainings for them.

Neighbors Helping Neighbors is a program was recently started. We are getting out and talking with Seniors whom do not get out, or can't get out, do not have many visitors. They might need oxygen, be wheelchair bound, or be someone that just needs to be checked up on.
